



Background


- Need to make a step change in the support for research careers



to provide valuable training for individuals *early post* registration who may have had limited exposure to real world research during their training to date.







New Generation Senior Clinical and Practitioner Research Award (SCAPRA)

- For registered HCPs, medics and dentists who have a PhD or MD
- Encourage those to return to research particularly within the NHS and care settings
- Underrepresented disciplines
 - HCPs, dentists, GPs
 - Medically qualified from underrepresented groups
 - Ethnicity, gender, geography





New Generation Senior Clinical and Practitioner Research Award

- Up to 75 awards per year
- 20-50% EFT up to 5 years
- Max of £20Kpa for training and development
- FEC for those based within Universities

Start date between 1st April and 30th Sep 2024


